


Preventing Vehicle-related Theft

Our Neighbourhood Watches and Peel Regional Police have noted an increase of vehicle break-ins and theft throughout Mississauga. Vehicle-related theft is often a crime of opportunity, and it is important for vehicle owners to mitigate the risk of these crimes occurring.

Here are some step neighbours can take to ensure vehicles in their community are protected:

- Lock it or Lose it Making a habit of doubling checking car door locks and windows and ensuring they are locked and closed can go a long way in protecting your vehicle from theft.
- Never leave your vehicle unattended As winter approaches it can be tempting
 to leave your car started to warm up
 while you wait inside your home. This
 leaves a great opportunity for thieves to
 easily drive away with your vehicle. We
 must NOT provide thieves with these
 opportunities!
- Remove temptations to commit crime against your vehicle Conceal or remove any valuables from your vehicle such as cash, garage door openers, wallets, or cellphones to discourage thieves from targeting your vehicle.
- Invest in added layers of security –
 Consider purchasing added mechanical
 security measures such as anti-theft
 screws for license plates, steering wheel
 locks, tracking devices, or Faraday bags
 for newer model car keys.



Watch members should note and report any suspicious activity or crime they witness to Peel Regional Police or Crime Stoppers. To ensure vehicle safety, every neighbour must do their part and practice these tips.
