Dangerous Driving

With the summer weather approaching people are eager to go outside, however the open roads have increased the concern for dangerous driving.

Dangerous driving is a serious criminal offence, where a driver is accused of driving in a reckless disregard for public safety. Dangerous driving must occur in a public place where the likelihood of people being present and getting hurt is high.

Some examples of dangerous driving include:

- Dangerous and excessive speeding
- Careless lane changes and weaving through tight traffic
- Driving while under the influence of alcohol or other substances
- Aggressive driving with disregard for the safety of others
- Displaying road rage

Dangerous driving can be reported to the Peel Regional Police Non-Emergency Line or the Online Reporting Tool. If you believe a driver to be an <u>immediate</u> danger to the public, you may also call 911.

You can help prevent dangerous driving in your neighbourhood by:

- Reporting dangerous driving to show it will not be tolerated.
- Set the example with <u>safe</u> driving, especially for the youth in your community.
- Request Slow Down signs from your Ward Councillor
- Participate in the City of Mississauga's Speed Watch Program and have a speed radar temporarily stationed on your street.
