Break & Enters: Be Ahead of the Game

As temperatures increase, so do property offences - including Home Break-Ins. Remember, most burglars don't want to encounter people either - which is why they will try your home when you're most likely to be away. Sometimes burglars will knock on homes during the day, to check the time of day certain homes might be empty. Be on the look out for unusual activity including:

- "Uber Drivers" who knock on your door to tell you they're here for your pick-up (even though you never called)
- Real-estate agents with no business cards; or similar practices.

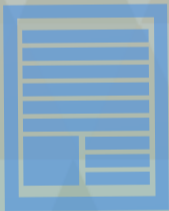

If you report something to Peel Regional Police, don't forget to tell your NW Team Lead as well! The role of the Team Lead is to relay that information to everyone else on the street all neighbours ("Watch members") are informed and aware.

For example: If you notice strange behaviour in your neighbourhood, or your security camera shows suspicious activity, sharing the information with all neighbours keeps us all on the look out. They might have information to contribute as well!
