When you leave your car unattended while warming up, this is an easy Christmas present for criminals! It won't feel like it, but your car only needs <u>10 seconds</u> to warm up, so there's no need to leave your car running, unattended and with the keys in!


• Always make your home look lived in! Winter adds another factor to consider as driveways that have not been shoveled and uncleaned cars can signal that no one is home. Be mindful of this for your own homes as well as your

neighbours.

 Coordinate efforts to help out neighbours that might need assistance with their cars and driveways.

• It gets dark early these days! Ensure front porches and driveways are <u>always properly lit</u>, especially if it's slippery.

 Depending on after school activities, your kids might be going home when it starts getting dark. Make sure plans are in place to get them home safely.



These are all simple solutions. But remember, you can always rely on your neighbours, Safe City Mississauga and Peel Regional Police, should you require any further assistance or advice!


White Ribbon Campaign 2019

Damage to Vehicle Theft From a Vehicle


